

Meet Our Performers:

Lety Briones started dancing folklorico when she was only seven years old in Mexico. When she was 12, she became a runway model, a profession that developed for more than 25 years. Lety took Middle Eastern dance classes with Saddie Marquart and Hebrew dances with Sarah Behar in Denver, Colorado. Later on, she performed at different important events. She prepared choreography for groups of young girls in Denver and Juarez, Mexico. Lety's passion is to dance for Hashem.

Rabbi Larry Karol joined Temple Beth-El in Las Cruces in 2011. He has extensive experience in Jewish education and communal activities, innovative worship services, Jewish musical creativity and interreligious and multicultural programs. She studies voice with Yvonne Marmolejo and is a member of the El Paso Choral Society Chamber Choir. Originally from Las Cruces, Kristin is a lawyer in El Paso and a board member of several local and national organizations including Congregation B'nai Zion and the Jewish Federation of Greater El Paso.

Rabbi Stephen A. Leon was born in Brooklyn, New York, and has been the head rabbi of Congregation B'nai Zion since 1986, often serving as cantor as well. In addition to leading services, overseeing Talmud Torah, and providing adult education courses, Rabbi Leon has presided over countless life cycle events for El Paso families. Rabbi Leon is a trusted friend and teacher for the Anusim and has helped many individuals and families make their return to Judaism.

Larry Lesser has won regional and national awards as a songwriter and as an educator.
