Course Objectives: Students are expected to have a clear understanding of the ideas of Calculus as a solid foundation for subsequent courses in mathematics and other disciplines as well as for direct application to real life situations.

Assignments: There will be an in-class assignment every class period, which you are to work on during class time. You are encouraged to work in groups on these assignments. You don't need to turn these in; they are for your own benefit. In addition, homework will be given on WebAssign. Your name will be uploaded by the instructor to your assigned class. Other homework will be assigned from problems in the textbook. There will be a quiz once a week that will be similar to homework problems from the book. The lowest quiz score will be dropped.

Assessment: Your overall grade will consist of the weighted average of your scores on the exams, quizzes, and the exit exam.

Grading Policy: The usual grading scale will be used for the module (90%-100% is an A, 80%-89% is a B, etc.). Your grade for the module will be weighted as follows:

Exit exam	50% (grade must be \geq 60%)
Quizzes	25%
